5.1 Royston Road Traffic

The Chairman reported that residents of Royston Road had suggested that flashing speed reduction signs be installed and had given examples. The Chairman stated that he thought moveable signs would be more effective. The Clerk suggested that, depending on the outcome of the Minor Highway Improvement bid which would be known by the April Parish Council meeting, the Police Traffic Officer be invited to a Parish Council meeting to discuss options. Cllr Pipe reported that his three minute presentation to the panel was given some sympathy and felt quite positive.

Cllr Jones asked why the existing give way feature could not be upgraded. Cllr Pipe stated that the County Engineer did not think that this would help as traffic could still speed up after it.

The Clerk had obtained the 30mph stickers for the refuse bins which would be handed out to residents of Royston Road.

5.2 Village Photographs

The Clerk confirmed that the village photographs, which used to hang in The Crown, had now been reframed and were ready to go up in the Village Hall.

5.3 Clunch Pit Access

Some physical measures had been installed including a barrier from Ashwell Stret onto the permissive path which leads to the Clunch pit. Cllr Pledger confirmed that the barrier was suitable for horses. Cllr Jones also confirmed that he had been through the barrier with a children's pushchair.
